

# Instructions **Cross Memorial**


The David Dylan Foundation believes visuals move community to compassion and help separate one's humanness from the addictive behavior. Real people that lived, not justice a statistic. With this in mind, the Memorial Cross Project (CONNECTION 2022) was inspired by versions of the McShin White Marker Project.

The memorial creates a safe and peaceful setting for everyone to step out of the shadows of shame with others that can say... "me too!"


### **Materials**

- 3- 6'x10' or 6'x8' sections of chain link fencing.
- 500 6" white tie wraps.
- 4- 6' steel landscape posts.
- 5 gallons of white exterior gloss paint.
- Paint spray gun or roller.
- Commercial stapler for connecting in center.
- Hot glue gun (optional to firmly secure attachment) of crosses).









- 500-14" paint sticks painted white.
- 500-21" paint sticks painted white.

#### Large crosses used in Memorial:

- 36-36" surveyors laths, painted white.
- 36- laths cut into 21" lengths, painted white.




### Instructions

- Lay out crosses in groups at a time depending upon space.
- Spray paint allow each side to dry up to 24 hours depending on humidity.
- Touch up with brush.
- Attach up to 3 crosses with one tie wrap, taping off space for event signage.
- Reserve 50 crosses for cross signing.
- Offer to accompany guest to attach cross (no tie).

ALASKA

- If reserve runs out, pull a cross out of the wrap on memorial for use.
- Ties can be added to loose crosses at the end of the event.
